NEW YORK, US, September 20 (Infosplusgabon) - United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres has urged global support for France's initiative to create the first international legally binding document on the environment, at an event held on the margins of the annual leaders' summit of the General Assembly.
"It is about our duty of care to provide an environment that supports the health, well-being, dignity, and prosperity of everyone on this planet," Mr. Guterres said on Tuesday. "Let us support this worthy initiative."
According to the Permanent Mission of France to the UN, which organised the event, threats to the environment are increasingly impacting the survival of mankind and the planet. It is, therefore, urgent to act and build a sustainable future.
However, experts have highlighted a clear legal challenge: international environment law is fragmented in many conventions and international declarations, the Mission noted.
As such, the Global Pact for the Environment will be the first international legally binding document that gathers and harmonises all environmental laws in one single document, a UN statement said.
